In December of 2003, we recieved our very first camcorder, which allowed us to make our very first films, Indiana Jones and the Forbidden Mayan Temple, Indiana Jones and the Egyptian Tomb, and Com 50. Even though they're not the highest quality films, they are still revered as the place where we started. In February 2004, the camcorder broke, and we were on the hunt for a replacement.

In April 2004, it was decided that the company's next film would be an Indiana Jones fan film titled *Indiana Jones and the Secret of the Leopard's Treasure*. This film soon became the groundwork for an entire trilogy of Indiana Jones fan films, the third of which was released February 2005 (more on that film later).

It has happened to every film company at sometime or another: while a project is in development, the schedule gets messed up and the project eventually gets cancelled. Mustache Maniacs Film Co. is no exception. This is just a tip of the iceberg of the studio projects that were never completed.




